About the Tour

For your convenience, the tour is divided into two parts. Both begin on Front Street at the Court Street Bridge (facing the Tioga County Courthouse). The West Walking Tour goes to the West of the bridge (left if you are standing at the bridge facing the Courthouse). The East Walking Tour goes to the East/right.

Because it is self-paced, you may start or stop your tour at any time, replaying stops as often as you wish. To begin your tour, just follow the simple instructions on the inside of this brochure.

The tour is good for 7 days. If you can't complete the tour all at once, you can stop and begin again where you left off by dialing back 607-354-4080.


